AI Tools

6 needs • sorted by heat

1. AI Replies Sound Fake and Awkward • Heat 8/10

Colleagues paste AI content in chats, long and empty, painful to read

PAIN Real questions drowned by AI fluff, key points diluted, extra time needed to decode

EXISTING Copying ChatGPT/Claude replies is easiest, but they feel plastic and unreadable

OPPORTUNITY Build a tool that rewrites AI output into natural human tone

COMPETITORS Grammarly ignores AI style, LLM style parameters are not adjustable

2. Search Results Full of AI Spam, Want to Block • Heat 7/10

Even recipe searches hit AI-generated fluff, verifying is more tiring than searching

PAIN Manually maintaining uprank/downrank lists, judging each site for AI content

EXISTING Kagi has AI labels but no auto-detection, Google ignores it entirely

OPPORTUNITY Auto-detect AI-generated sites and downrank them based on user preferences, improving over time

COMPETITORS Kagi (manual weighting), Google (no AI filtering)

3. SaaS Acquisition Hikes Price 15x, Forced to Build Alternative • Heat 6/10

Harvest acquired by Bending Spoons, bills skyrocket, old customers have no leverage

PAIN High data migration costs, competitors also pricey, forced to vibe-code a replacement

EXISTING Harvest and Toggl require subscriptions, self-hosted options are maintenance-heavy

OPPORTUNITY Offer one-click migration, open-source self-hosted lightweight tool to capture users abandoned by price hikes

COMPETITORS Harvest (post-acquisition price hike), Clockify, Toggl

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

4. Agent Knowledge Base Unreadable by Humans • Heat 6/10

Company data fed into knowledge base, agents can query but humans can't understand content

- PAIN** Knowledge base only machine-readable, no human review, errors go unnoticed
- EXISTING** Setoku uses data lakes for knowledge bases, abandoning human readability
- OPPORTUNITY** Create dual-layer knowledge representation for humans and agents, editable without programmers
- COMPETITORS** Vector databases and Setoku only consider machine reading

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

5. Linux Desktop Tech Strong but Lacks Product Polish • Heat 5/10

Distros fragmented, default settings messy, hours of setup after install

- PAIN** Lacks strong opinions, good defaults, full hardware support; non-engineers avoid it
- EXISTING** Omarchy is integrating but early, System76 covers only its own hardware
- OPPORTUNITY** Polish the entire Linux desktop experience as a product, hardware and software together
- COMPETITORS** Omarchy (new), Fedora, System76 all lack holistic product feel

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

6. PMs Want to Edit Agent MD but Fear Git • Heat 5/10

AI agent config files live in Git, non-programmers dare not touch them

- PAIN** Need Google Docs-like online editing, comments, sharing links; currently stuck in IDE
- EXISTING** Notula is developing but immature, traditional Markdown editors lack Git workflow
- OPPORTUNITY** Wrap Git repos in a Google Docs-style collaborative document interface
- COMPETITORS** Notula (new), GitHub web editor (hard for non-programmers)

// AI DEVELOPMENT

AI Development

13 needs • sorted by heat

1. Terminal Is Slow and Old, TUI Feels Outdated • Heat 9/10

Remote development relies on terminals; TUI uses ANSI escapes, losing to native GUI.

PAIN Terminal protocol is primitive; partial redraws rely on hacks, and developers must learn new APIs for each framework.

EXISTING tmux and Zellij only split screens; terminal GUIs haven't advanced since Turbo Pascal.

OPPORTUNITY Redesign terminal rendering protocol to run native-level GUIs in remote tools.

COMPETITORS Zellij (Kitty graphics just starting), tmux, VS Code Remote

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

2. Multiple Agents Working Simultaneously Is Chaotic • Heat 8/10

Multiple agents handle tasks in parallel, reporting via text spam, hard to monitor.

PAIN Unclear which agent is stuck, calling tools, or waiting for replies; all guesswork.

EXISTING Munder Difflin's X/N display is confusing; LangGraph has code but no visualization.

OPPORTUNITY Create spatial dashboard for agent states: tool calls, dependencies, progress at a glance.

COMPETITORS LangGraph, CrewAI, AutoGen are frameworks lacking operational views.

3. Token Bills Like Phone Traps, Models Downgraded • Heat 8/10

Claude Code A/B tests lower thinking effort, costing more for worse results.

PAIN API billing is a black box; vendors adjust knobs anytime, users can't compare or complain.

EXISTING Anthropic doesn't disclose changes; OpenRouter only shows price, not quality.

OPPORTUNITY Build neutral audit layer for usage and output quality to monitor model vendors.

COMPETITORS OpenRouter (resells only), LangSmith (tests apps, not billing).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

4. AI Agents Struggle on Windows, Wasting Tokens • Heat 7/10

Codex and Claude run tasks on Windows, facing endless command-line compatibility issues.

- PAIN** Windows toolchain is fragmented; agents get stuck on paths, encoding, permissions, retrying.
- EXISTING** WSL has pitfalls; Microsoft Copilot doesn't solve agent shell adaptation.
- OPPORTUNITY** Build native Windows agent runtime with stable adaptation layer for common commands.
- COMPETITORS** Microsoft WSL/Copilot inadequate; community advises switching to Mac.

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

5. AI Autofix Patches Introduce New Vulnerabilities • Heat 7/10

Copilot Autofix claims to fix vulnerabilities but introduces new security risks.

- PAIN** AI suggestions seem reasonable; manual review misses logic flaws, merging causes issues.
- EXISTING** GitHub Copilot Autofix has failures; Snyk doesn't review AI-generated logic.
- OPPORTUNITY** Provide independent security validation and sandbox replay for AI patches before merge.
- COMPETITORS** GitHub Copilot Autofix (had incidents), Snyk (static scanning mainly).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

6. MCP Connections Fill Context Window Quickly • Heat 7/10

Each MCP adds tool definitions to context, filling it before agent works.

- PAIN** Tool calls compete with tasks for context, visibly degrading response quality.
- EXISTING** MCP official roadmap is changing, but frameworks still load everything.
- OPPORTUNITY** Implement on-demand loading and tool compression to include only needed MCP definitions.
- COMPETITORS** MCP official (still roadmap), LangChain (coarse loading strategy).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • NEW

7. Local Models Seem Dumber Due to Quantization • Heat 6/10

Ollama defaults to Q4 quantized models, significantly different from original weights, undisclosed.

- PAIN** Users think model is bad, but default quantization is too low, and no comparison available.
- EXISTING** Ollama defaults to Q4 without notice; LM Studio has options but no effect comparison.
- OPPORTUNITY** Clarify quantization level, quality loss, VRAM usage at install; support one-click comparison.
- COMPETITORS** Ollama (opaque defaults), LM Studio (missing comparison).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

8. AI Ignores Constraints, Uses Banned Libraries • Heat 6/10

Constraints are clear, but generated code still does its own thing, causing rework.

- PAIN** AI code compiles but violates project standards; fixing is more tiring than rewriting.
- EXISTING** Cursor rules and Aider conventions are just prompts, not enforced.
- OPPORTUNITY** Add rule validator at agent output to intercept violations and explain reasons.
- COMPETITORS** Cursor (rules rely on self-discipline), Aider (only YAML conventions).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

9. Rust Dependency Builds Inject Malicious Code • Heat 6/10

Popular crate like Arrayref is poisoned; developers are defenseless.

- PAIN** Relying on cargo-deny and manual audits can't keep up with poisoning speed.
- EXISTING** cargo-crev community is small; crates.io review is ineffective.
- OPPORTUNITY** Sandbox build scripts, automatically alert and rollback on dangerous behavior.
- COMPETITORS** cargo-deny (static scanning), Socket.dev (JS-focused).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

10. Claude Writes Code with Emojis and Exclamations • Heat 5/10

Claude's claudisms annoy users, driving them to ChatGPT.

- PAIN** Code comments and commit messages are full of marketing tone, breaking immersion.
- EXISTING** Claudette only changes system prompt, treating symptoms not root cause.
- OPPORTUNITY** Enforce hard style constraints at agent tool layer, removing emojis and exaggerations.
- COMPETITORS** Claudette (open source but shallow), official style parameters ineffective.

For: Solo • Difficulty 2/5 • UP

11. GitHub Notifications Unreliable, Issues Ignored • Heat 5/10

Settings are on, but new issues and PRs don't notify; maintainers rely on manual refresh.

- PAIN** Maintainers miss critical collaboration messages; community communication is by chance.
- EXISTING** GitHub's built-in notifications have bugs; self-hosting Gitea/GitLab has high barriers.
- OPPORTUNITY** Build neutral GitHub event aggregation and notification layer, never missing signals.
- COMPETITORS** GitHub (unreliable notifications), third-party bots (incomplete coverage).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • DOWN

12. Rust LSP Uses 10GB RAM, Coding Becomes Laggy • Heat 5/10

rust-analyzer relies on memory, causing severe lag on large repos.

- PAIN** Indexing is all in memory; large repos cause frequent GC and typing delays.
- EXISTING** Glancer claims 100x memory savings, but community is skeptical.
- OPPORTUNITY** Redesign LSP storage with disk cache and incremental indexing, reducing memory to 1/10.
- COMPETITORS** rust-analyzer (memory hog), Glancer (unverified new approach).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

13. AI Model for Technical Docs Could Be Lucrative • Heat 5/10

General LLMs write code okay but docs are either vague or miss the point.

- PAIN** API references, architecture guides, usage guides must be written manually; AI output unusable.
- EXISTING** ChatGPT/Claude write technical docs with confused terminology and invented APIs.
- OPPORTUNITY** Specialize in technical writing corpus, output docs with examples ready for repos.
- COMPETITORS** General models all fail; no dedicated technical writing model exists.

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

// AI HARDWARE

AI Hardware

4 needs • sorted by heat

1. Repairable Phone with Strong Security • Heat 8/10

Fairphone is repairable but outdated; iPhone is secure but unrepairable.

PAIN Eco-conscious users face a trade-off: Fairphone lacks security, iPhone forces planned obsolescence.

EXISTING Fairphone has EOL kernel, iPhone blocks repairs, GrapheneOS only supports Pixel.

OPPORTUNITY Build a phone combining repairability, hardware security, and long-term updates.

COMPETITORS Fairphone (insecure), iPhone (unrepairable), GrapheneOS (limited hardware).

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

2. Consumer VR Camera Gap • Heat 7/10

Creating VR content requires hacked 360 cameras; no official ecosystem tools.

PAIN iPhone captures only flat photos, external gear is complex, quality content is scarce.

EXISTING Apple offers nothing, Insta360 is not VR180, pro gear is expensive.

OPPORTUNITY Make a consumer VR180 camera with one-click capture, in-camera stitching, direct headset transfer.

COMPETITORS Insta360 (panorama focus), Apple (absent), pro VR cameras (costly).

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

3. Old iPhone Repurposing Solution • Heat 6/10

Old iPhones lose value; battery swaps or dual-SIM mods don't help.

PAIN Using as secondary screen is wasteful, as monitor lacks ecosystem, no official reuse plan.

EXISTING OpenDisplay turns it into a Mac monitor but is limited.

OPPORTUNITY Create a unified system to turn old phones into smart home panels, monitors, retro consoles.

COMPETITORS OpenDisplay (monitor only), scattered apps.

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

4. Xiaohongshu TV App Opportunity • Heat 5/10

Users want to browse Xiaohongshu on TV; no official tvOS version.

PAIN After long videos, switching to short videos requires picking up the phone, breaking the flow.

EXISTING Bilibili and Douyin have TV apps; Xiaohongshu is absent, third-party options are immature.

OPPORTUNITY Develop a polished tvOS client for Xiaohongshu with immersive big-screen browsing.

COMPETITORS Xiaohongshu official (no TV version), third-party apps just launched.

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • NEW

// AI CONTENT

AI Content

2 needs • sorted by heat

1. AI Writing Lacks Natural Rhythm • Heat 8/10

LLMs break long sentences into choppy fragments, losing language rhythm.

PAIN AI-generated text is instantly recognizable, but cannot produce vivid, natural paragraphs.

EXISTING All models are similar; prompts cannot change underlying writing style.

OPPORTUNITY Train a model that understands sentence rhythm and cadence to eliminate AI tone.

COMPETITORS Claude/GPT are homogeneous; no model focuses on human writing rhythm.

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

2. Hollywood AI Video Tools Lack Pro Workflow • Heat 7/10

Cinematic AI video runs on pro clusters; home tools like ComfyUI are insufficient.

PAIN Single shot generation too slow for production; no tools designed for team collaboration.

EXISTING ComfyUI is hobbyist; Runway hasn't integrated professional pipelines.

OPPORTUNITY Build distributed AI video rendering and asset management pipeline for studios.

COMPETITORS Runway (consumer), ComfyUI (single-machine), big tech in-house (not public).

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

// AI LIFESTYLE

AI Lifestyle

4 needs • sorted by heat

1. Cabbage Soaked in Formaldehyde • Heat 7/10

Hebei cabbage exceeds formaldehyde limits; consumers lack self-testing methods.

PAIN Government sampling lags, home test strips inaccurate, lab testing costly and slow.

EXISTING Test strips unreliable, lab tests cost hundreds, not for daily use.

OPPORTUNITY Offer affordable home food safety tests with batch report via QR code.

COMPETITORS Home strips (inaccurate), lab services (expensive), platform sampling (limited).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

2. Men's Skincare Search Full of Ads • Heat 7/10

Douyin and Xiaohongshu content contradictory; hard to distinguish genuine reviews.

PAIN Over 30 with acne seeking reliable solution; comments full of bots, wrong buys cost money and skin.

EXISTING Xiaohongshu untrustworthy, Meili Xiuxing only checks ingredients, not choices.

OPPORTUNITY Recommend based on ingredients and real user feedback, no sponsored ads.

COMPETITORS Xiaohongshu (sponsored), Meili Xiuxing (incomplete data), Zhihu (soft ads).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

3. Deceased Relative's Locked Phone • Heat 7/10

Deceased's Redmi phone locked, containing memories, photos, and assets.

PAIN Brute force takes 10,000 tries with 5-min waits; manufacturer after-sales slow.

EXISTING Apple/Google legacy features absent domestically; after-sales requires proof and delays.

OPPORTUNITY Provide trusted digital legacy trustee service, pre-store keys for designated family.

COMPETITORS Apple legacy contacts (incomplete in China), manufacturer after-sales (slow).

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • NEW

4. Half of Job Postings Are Ghost Jobs • Heat 6/10

Companies post fake jobs to collect resumes or appear thriving; applications wasted.

PAIN Job sites rely on fake posts for metrics; applicants can't verify authenticity.

EXISTING Indeed and Boss Zhipin don't verify; Ontario law just requires labeling.

OPPORTUNITY Build browser extension aggregating real hiring signals to avoid ghost jobs.

COMPETITORS Job sites (the problem), legal advocacy (limited regions).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

// AI EDUCATION

AI Education

5 needs • sorted by heat

1. Anki Cards Don't Teach Speaking • Heat 8/10

Treating language learning as memorization fails without context.

PAIN 35,000 cards later, direction was wrong; time wasted on repetition.

EXISTING Anki is mainstream SRS but treats language as a fact database.

OPPORTUNITY Embed vocabulary in real contexts for exposure learning; review becomes reading.

COMPETITORS Anki (mechanical), Duolingo (gamified but shallow)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

2. AI Homework Passes, Exams Fail • Heat 7/10

AI-written homework inflates grades while real skills decline.

PAIN Plagiarism tools can't catch AI rewrites; closed-book exams are last defense.

EXISTING Turnitin bypassable; exam platforms use fixed question banks.

OPPORTUNITY Randomized tests with unlimited retakes; treat failure as signal, not punishment.

COMPETITORS Turnitin (ineffective vs AI), exam platforms (fixed banks)

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

3. Juniors Can't Code Without AI • Heat 7/10

Juniors ask AI first, get stuck for weeks, avoid seniors.

PAIN Old generation grew via struggle and mentorship; AI removes struggle, killing learning paths.

EXISTING Cursor/Codex give answers, increasing dependency; companies have no alternatives.

OPPORTUNITY Build teaching agent: ask questions first, give hints, preserve productive struggle.

COMPETITORS Cursor (answers), GitHub Copilot (same), LeetCode (no AI guidance)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

4. No Language Practice Environment • Heat 6/10

Non-native speakers rely on AI translation, never improve.

PAIN No low-pressure practice; AI translation is too easy, becomes excuse not to learn.

EXISTING Duolingo lacks real practice; language exchange apps have high awkwardness.

OPPORTUNITY Role-play with instant correction for low-pressure speaking practice; face fears.

COMPETITORS Duolingo (not practical), AI chat (no systematic correction), iTalki (expensive)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

5. Coders Can't Present on Stage • Heat 5/10

CS students lack presentation skills; improv classes rare but effective.

PAIN Writing code and speaking clearly are different skills; workplace communication is trial by fire.

EXISTING Few universities offer The Eloquent Presenter; industry training too costly.

OPPORTUNITY AI role-play and improv coach for anytime, anywhere expression practice.

COMPETITORS Toastmasters (offline), AI chat (no structured training)

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • NEW

// AI HEALTH

AI Health

4 needs • sorted by heat

1. Sick and Tracking, Six Apps Failed • Heat 9/10

Chronic patients seek tracking tools but find them complex or lacking, abandoning all.

- PAIN** Blood sugar, meds, symptoms tracked separately; data not exportable; can't persist two weeks.
- EXISTING** Bearable rigid, Apple Health collects but doesn't explain, Notion templates DIY.
- OPPORTUNITY** Build chat-based symptom tracker: upload lab results, describe symptoms, auto-organize history.
- COMPETITORS** Bearable, Apple Health, Notion fail on long-term usability.

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

2. Calorie Burn Guessed, Weight Loss Mystical • Heat 6/10

Maintenance calories fluctuate with state; static formulas are inaccurate.

- PAIN** TDEE affected by exercise, stress, sleep; no dynamic updates based on real data.
- EXISTING** MyFitnessPal logs but doesn't calibrate; macrocodex is nascent.
- OPPORTUNITY** Use daily weight feedback to reverse-engineer true burn, provide dynamic calorie budget.
- COMPETITORS** MyFitnessPal (static), macrocodex (new), Apple Watch (only closed loop).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • UP

3. Gaining Weight at Work, No Overeating • Heat 5/10

Diet unchanged but weight rises; cause unknown, only guesswork.

- PAIN** Sedentary, stress, takeout, sleep all possible; no multi-factor analysis tool.
- EXISTING** Bands track activity, apps track diet; none link work schedule to weight.
- OPPORTUNITY** Combine work schedule, sleep, diet logs to attribute weight gain, give actionable advice.
- COMPETITORS** Apple Watch (activity only), Boohee (diet only).

For: Solo • Difficulty 3/5 • STABLE

4. Tick Bite Testing, Home Kits Inaccurate • Heat 5/10

Want to know Lyme infection; only lab results after mailing samples.

PAIN Lateral flow strips lack precision; qPCR devices costly and bulky; home market empty.

EXISTING Home strips inaccurate, lab waits; Cepheid targets medical institutions.

OPPORTUNITY Develop disposable microfluidic PCR, read results in 30 minutes from sample.

COMPETITORS Home strips (inaccurate), Cepheid (expensive), Labs (slow).

For: Enterprise • Difficulty 5/5 • UP

// AI FRONTIER

AI Frontier

3 needs • sorted by heat

1. EU Packaging Rules Force Small Sellers to Delist • Heat 6/10

Small electronics sellers can't grasp compliance, so they delist and wait.

PAIN Packaging, labels, recycling declarations overwhelm; lawyers cost too much.

EXISTING Official guides are dense; law firms charge hundreds per consult; no small-seller tool.

OPPORTUNITY Auto-generate compliance checklists and packaging plans by category for a few hundred euros.

COMPETITORS Law firms (expensive), EU official portal (enterprise-focused)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 3/5 • NEW

2. AI Firms Scan Out-of-Print Books, Then Discard Them • Heat 6/10

Massive scans of rare library books are destroyed with no systematic archiving.

PAIN Paper books are non-renewable; AI firms take data, not originals; no digital fire brigade.

EXISTING Internet Archive is in litigation; Google Books is commercial and closed.

OPPORTUNITY Build a hybrid nonprofit-commercial network to archive rare scans, so originals can be discarded safely.

COMPETITORS Internet Archive (legal risk), Google Books (no sharing)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • UP

3. SOC2 Evidence Collection Tool Costs \$10K a Year • Heat 5/10

Small firms want SOC2 but Drata/Vanta are pricey; manual collection is exhausting.

PAIN Evidence scattered across cloud, logs, code; all-night prep before audits.

EXISTING Drata/Vanta start at \$10K/year; open-source tools are incomplete.

OPPORTUNITY Offer low-cost self-serve SOC2 evidence collection; \$50 can be respectable.

COMPETITORS Drata, Vanta (expensive), open-source fission-accountant (new)

For: Small Team • Difficulty 4/5 • STABLE

// BIG PICTURE

Big Company View (Enterprise)

Directions that need strategic synergy, scale and brand — beyond what solo or small teams can pursue.

1. Terminal Is Slow and Old, TUI Feels Outdated • Heat 9/10 • AI Development

Remote development relies on terminals; TUI uses ANSI escapes, losing to native GUI.

STRATEGIC Terminal is the gateway to developer infrastructure; owning the protocol means owning the remote toolchain.

INCUMBENTS Microsoft Windows Terminal and Zellij still support legacy ANSI protocols.

TIMING AI agents run heavily in terminals, making protocol bottlenecks critical.

2. Repairable Phone with Strong Security • Heat 8/10 • AI Hardware
